By the nature of their work, some employees have fluctuating work hours - in early one day and out late the next. As a result, employees had to manually check office keys in and out and, according to Glass, that was becoming a problem. "It's like night and day because all I have to do now is program new keys for a certain time and not have to worry about someone coming in after hours," Glass said. "We also have a storage room that previously was accessible using the front door key. With CLIQ, we can also limit what doors people can and can't access."
